Colorado Health Partnerships (CHP) is the behavioral health organization providing quality mental health and substance use services to Medicaid eligible members in Southern and Western Colorado. We are a partnership of eight Community Mental Health Centers (Mind Springs, Mid-Western Colorado Community Mental Health, Axis Health System, San Luis Valley Mental Health Center, Spanish Peaks Behavioral Health, SouthEast Mental Health Services, and AspenPointe) and ValueOptions®, the nation's largest independent behavioral health and wellness company.

CHP seeks to form working relationships with Criminal Justice System stakeholders and connect Criminal Justice System populations with medically necessary behavioral health treatment. One method for enhancing communication we would like to share with you is our new CHP Criminal Justice Toll-Free Line.

The CHP Criminal Justice Systems (CJS) toll-free line (855-761-4149) was established as a method of communication to aid those with involvement in the Criminal Justice System to fully access their Medicaid benefits. If an individual receives their Medicaid benefits and need help navigating the behavioral health system our customer service staff is available to assist via the CJS toll-free line. The Medicaid member can download our Colorado Health Partnerships Member Handbook at our website by clicking on the *For Members tab*. The Member Handbook is located on the left hand panel. This Member Handbook has the name, location, and contact for each of CHP's eight community mental health centers. The member can call the center which is in the county they reside directly to make an appointment for behavioral health services.

Correctional staff helping those under their supervision can also utilize the CJS toll-free line to ask questions about Medicaid benefits and locate a behavioral healthcare provider accepting new Medicaid patients in the member's area.

Colorado Health Partnerships is here to help answer questions, find community resources, and ensure needed behavioral health services are attained in a timely manner. We look forward to working more closely with the Colorado Criminal Justice System to accomplish this goal.

Please note that the area where the member currently resides may not be the responsible BHO for the member's Medicaid. The most common situation in which this happens is when parolee from one BHO area is placed under parole supervision in another area. It is still possible for the member to obtain services even when they are living outside the area (BHO) responsible for them. Most often, services would be delivered by the local mental health center.
